

## SJHS STUDENTS DONATE 3D PRINTED PROSTHETIC EMPATHY HAND TO NEW YORK HALL OF SCIENCE

Last winter, St. Joseph High School students donated an "Empathy Hand" to the New York Hall of Science for their event entitled "Engineering 3D Printed Assistive Devices - Kids Creating Solutions to Authentic Problems."

Many people think of 3D printing as fun but frivolous, but in fact it's being used to create important functional objects. Did you know that engineers are now 3D printing sophisticated robotic devices to help amputees and others born with missing limbs? Prosthetic limbs can cost in the tens of thousands of dollars and are often not covered by insurance, and younger users quickly outgrow their prostheses. A 3D-printed robotic limb, on the other hand, is much more affordable - it costs about \$50, for example, to make one hand.

St. Joseph High School students designed and printed a very special 3D robotic hand using the SJHS Fab Lab 3D printers - in addition to being fully functional, it can it can also be tried on by those who have hands, so that they can feel what it is like to use a prosthetic limb.

The New York Hall of Science was impressed by the dual purpose - empathy and functionality - of our donation, and told us that ours was their favorite submission! This project-based learning activity is a great opportunity for our students to see for themselves how new technologies can address medical problems, and they are busy printing more hands for needy children in communities around the country.










#### SJHS STEP TEAM: CHSAA CHAMPS!

Last spring, the SJHS Step team competed in the Catholic High School Athletic Association (CHSAA) tournament at Queens College and won 1st place! Winning the CHSAA Championship was especially exciting because 2017 marked the 10-year anniversary of the SJHS Step team. Stepping is a sport that uses the body as a percussive instrument, creating complex beats through movements including stomping, clapping and shouting, and it is rooted in movement and rhythm traditions from African and Afro-Caribbean traditions. What makes the Lady Cougars' style special is that their stepping is inspired by their faith in Jesus Christ. They step with authority and precision, always seeking to spread a message of hope and God's love.







#### JV AND VARSITY BASKETBALL TEAMS WIN 1ST PLACE

Last year marked the first time in St. Joseph's 113-year history that we fielded a Varsity Basketball team as well as a JV team. The varsity team played in the CHSAA B Division and ended up winning the Division Championship. The varsity team would go on to lose in the State Championship game to St. Thomas Aquinas High School. Our JV team also won the CHSAA B Division championship last year, and both teams moved up to the A Division at the end of the season. Go, Lady Cougars!

#### FAB LAB RIBBON CUTTING WITH BLACK GIRLS CODE

In late March, SJHS supporters and partners came to our School Fab Lab's official opening ceremony. Tiana Kara, marketing director of Black Girls Code, cut the ribbon, and Principal Latham gave a presentation on the value of introducing students to the kinds of tools the Fab Lab offers. The Fab Lab is St. Joseph High School's very own makerspace, where students can make, learn, explore and collaborate using a combination of high-tech and low-tech tools. Guided by their tech teachers and a project-based curriculum, students will develop critical 21st century skills in the fields of science, technology, engineering, art and math. In our Fab Lab, students will be introduced to 3D printing, laser cutting and computer-aided design. Makerspaces are places where one's imagination can come alive and shape exciting and innovative creations.


## **COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS**

#### ST. JOSEPH'S COLLEGE EARLY SCHOLARS PROGRAM

St. Joseph's College offers ambitious students a "bridge" to the college experience by allowing them to enroll in college classes while still in high school. Juniors and seniors who have a B+ average can enroll in the Early Scholars Program at St. Joseph's College, where they can choose from any freshman introductory course offered by the English, Law, Psychology, Criminology and Art departments. Students, who pay only \$100 per course, can earn as many as 12 college credits over two years, gaining a track record to show to prospective colleges and getting a head start on their studies.

#### MOUSE NAMES ST. JOSEPH HIGH SCHOOL A "SUPERCONDUCTOR SITE"

Mouse is a national youth development organization that empowers young people to use technology to solve real problems and make meaningful change in our world. Like St. Joseph High School, Mouse is committed to creating more diversity in STEM by engaging students from underserved communities across the country. Through this partnership, Mouse helped get our students excited about STEM by working with them on projects that included green technology, 3D printing, sewable technology, circuitry and electronics. Mouse also provided professional development for our faculty, helping them integrate technology into their curricula. ## **STUDENT SUCCESS STORIES**



#### **Shafrarisi Bonner '17**

The success story of Shafrarisi Bonner '17 starts with a family that has always protected her and lifted her up. Literally. When Shaf was 4, her 12-year-old sister, Kharisi, shielded her and a young cousin from a drive-by shooting in their Bed-Stuy neighborhood. Although her arm was shattered by a bullet, Kharisi got the girls to safety. In honor of her bravery, the local police department awarded Kharisi a scholarship that covered her freshman tuition at St. Joseph High School the following year. Not surprisingly, where Kharisi led, her sisters followed: Mharisi '11, now pursuing a Masters at Columbia University Teachers College; Aharisi '13, a recent Barnard grad; and finally Shafrarisi. Like her smart and spirited sisters, Shaf took advantage of everything St. Joe's had to offer. She wrote for the school newspaper, edited the yearbook, served senior citizens with the Glamour Gals, participated in the Speech Team, and as an upperclassman,

landed a spot with the Sadie Nash Leadership Project to promote activism among young women. The Sadie Nash team also nominated her to be a Brooklyn Youth Fellow, an initiative of the Brooklyn Community Foundation to encourage grassroots participation in social justice issues. With all this under her belt, Shafrarisi was among a group of students chosen by the College Office to compete for a scholarship from the country's most prestigious college access program, the Posse Foundation. Shaf loved meeting the Posse staff and students and made it to the second round, where she had to choose and rank five match schools. Indiana's DePauw University, with its Prindle Institute for Ethics and focus on student civic engagement, rose to the top. DePauw spoke to Shaf's passion for social justice and her experience resonated with the DePauw interviewers, too. As St. Joseph's first Posse Scholar, Shaf will receive four years of free tuition and academic support at DePauw. St. Joseph's and the Bonner family - especially Kharisi, now a young mother - couldn't be prouder.



#### **Alemtsehay Getahun '18**

St. Joseph High School opened its doors in 1904 as a commercial school for immigrant girls, and it still welcomes and supports many first-generation students, such as Alemtsehay Getahun '18. Alemtsehay and her family emigrated from Ethiopia when she was 12, and she showed up for 6th grade in New York City speaking only her native Amharic. It was sink or swim, and resilient Alemtsehay swam. She read constantly, took extra English classes after school and happily soaked up English via the Disney Channel. By 7th grade, Alemtsehay tested at grade level in English, the first of many victories. In 8th grade, she was accepted into Student Sponsor Partners (SSP), an organization that matches promising disadvantaged students to excellent partner schools and to financial sponsor-mentors. Alemtsehay selected

St. Joseph's from among the SSP schools because of its strong values, challenging academics and lots of extracurricular opportunities, in and out of school. As a sophomore, Alemtsehay won a spot on The Moth's All-City Story Slam team and spent Saturdays with other New York City high school students learning how to extemporaneously tell a true personal story in performance. By her junior year, Alemtsehay was fluent and confident enough to land two internships, one at Breakfast with Alice, a creative brand-marketing consultancy, and the other with Futures and Options, a nonprofit that pairs underserved youths with local businesses. Working four days a week after school quickly taught Alemtsehay how to manage her time, and her office duties sharpened her writing, communication, and social media skills. The highlight of her junior year came in the spring, when SSP nominated her for the Peter M. Flanigan Scholarship, which awards students \$40,000 toward their college education. At her interview by a panel of five SSP representatives, Alemtsehay shared the story of her personal journey from her childhood in Ethiopia to her teen years in New York City, and her hard work, perseverance and academic excellence deeply impressed the panel. She won the scholarship, the first time a St. Joseph student has received this honor. Strong in math and engineering and an avid reader and writer, Alemtsehay will surely have many more doors open for her.

## STUDENT SUCCESS STORIES



#### Isabella Castillo '20

Bright and bubbly, Isabella Castillo plans to one day travel the world as an archaeologist. "Every object you find has a story," she says, and she's excited by the idea of studying artifacts from long-lost civilizations to learn how the ancients lived day to day. She also hopes to learn new languages, so that she can communicate with people the world over. This drive to connect with others surely has much to do with Isabella's experience at Hour Children, an organization that helps formerly incarcerated women find housing and work, supporting them and their children as they rebuild their lives. Isabella and her brother grew up attending Hour Children's programs for children and teens, where she and her family found assistance, care, compassion, and lifelong friendships. She was paired with a great mentor who helps her stay on track with school and other daily activities, and her personal growth has been guided by the philosophy of love and reconciliation embraced by Sister Tesa Fitzgerald, CSJ, the founder of Hour Children. To the Sisters of St. Joseph,

love and reconciliation mean that people must accept and forgive past mistakes, and then move on from them, rather than be defined by and judged for them forever. To show her appreciation for all Hour Children gave her, Isabella returned to volunteer in their daycare the summer after her freshman year. At the same time, she was accepted into the Intrepid Air and Space Museum's competitive GOALS for Girls Summer Intensive, a six-week program that offers 50 8th and 9th grade girls the opportunity to expand their STEM knowledge and skills through workshops, field trips and presentations on everything from programming and nanotechnology to sailing, marine biology, and naval engineering. Isabella's favorite activity was the coding class that she and the other participants took at Yale University, which opened her eyes to new possibilities for her future. But wherever Isabella ends up- whether traveling the world as an archaeologist, or debating foreign diplomats at the United Nations (her Plan B) – she is sure to bring along her caring spirit, cheerful attitude and kind heart.

## **OUR AWARD-WINNING SPEECH TEAM**

One of the highlights of St. Joseph's co-curricular program is the Speech team, which has been named one of the top five in the country by the National Catholic Forensics League. The team's coach of the last 30 years, Mr. David Risley, helps each student select a piece of dramatic prose or poetry that enables her to perform to her highest potential. He then works one-on-one with each team member several times a week, including weekends, to perfect her delivery, timing, intonation, presentation and poise. Their combined efforts pay off: Over recent years, 15 students have won State championships, 10 have been National Finalists, and one won first place in the US in her category. The team is the source of great school pride, and young women who gain a spot on the team blossom into our most successful students. On Mr. Risley's 30th anniversary with SJHS, we asked one of his students to share her experience.

#### David-

When I think about my high-school experience one person stands out, David Risley.

In your 30 years at St. Joseph you have touched the lives of many young women. The attention and effort you have given to each one of us is truly remarkable.

I fondly look back on that time as so important in the development of who I am today.

I learned what commitment was by watching you. Each week you spent your personal time ensuring that each of us was 110% ready for each competition, whether that competition was Local, State or National. "Give me more," "I don't believe you," "bigger," "Get angry!" I remember it like it was yesterday.

We crammed into your car like sardines and traversed the far reaches of Brooklyn, Queens and Long Island.

You taught me that I could achieve more than what I, or other people, thought that I was capable of.

I know you will continue to do great things and touch the lives of young women for years to come.

Thank you for touching mine so profoundly!




