This might be a personal, creative or academic response—you decide. The important thing is that it demonstrates **the thinking that you did as a result of the reading**.
- Whatever you do, **do not summarize the book!**
- Have this assignment and the book that you read in class with you on **Friday**, **September 13**th.

Your thoughtful response to the book and your ability to discuss it in class will be one of the first impressions

your English teacher will have of you next year. Come prepared to think, talk and possibly write about the book you read on **Friday**, **September 13th**. Your English teacher will provide more details in the first week of school.
